

The Old World influences also carried over to the decor, where a color palette of blues, dusty rose and champagne gold took inspiration from Marie Antoinette. At the reception, a tent with elegant draping created a romantic ambiance with amber lighting, candles and chandeliers. Speaking of the glow: Their wedding occurred on an evening when fireworks literally light up the sky, signaling the beginning of a new tomorrow and a bright future. 


